<b>Course Description:</b>	Development of expressive and receptive skills. Emphasis upon whole word and phrase recognition and reading of fingerspelling and numbering embedded in signed sentences.	

**Learning Outcomes:**

At the end of the course, the student will be able to

- A. identify how to express uncertainty, how to get clarification culturally appropriate;
- B. identify and demonstrate ASL vocabulary and grammar;
- C. analyze culture/language notes;
- D. apply numbers in ASL in a variety of methods; and
- E. increase and synthesize the use of fingerspelling in language.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

- 1. participate in group activities (A and D).
- 2. construct paragraph and demonstrate on video (B).
- 3. justify opinions on deaf culture/language (C).
- 4. role play scenarios utilizing appropriate vocabulary and grammar (A, B and D).
