in French. A study of the fundamentals of French grammar, with special emphasis given to oral practice in the language, conversation, aural comprehension, and elementary reading

selections.

- 1. pronounce French words correctly (A, B, and C).
- 2. read in French (B).
- 3. translate common daily sentences (A, B, C, D, and F).
- 4. count, set dates, tell time, and indicate possession (A, B, and C).
- 5. write simple sentences with the help of a bilingual dictionary (D, E and F).

Course Requirements: Students are required to complete exercises in every

assigned chapter. No test will be taken without

homework being finished. Students will be evaluated once orally in an interview of five and ten minutes in the middle of the semester.

Tests will be given in addition to a comprehensive final.
