Course Title: Paramedic Clinical Experience

Course Prerequisites: EMTP 209

Textbooks: None

Course Description:

Clinical practicum at approved hospital departments designed to provide the student with prescribed patient care experience, under the supervision of a preceptor. Clinical instruction. In order to register for EMTP 201 - EMTP 215 student must have been selected for the program.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course the student will

A. At the end of this course, the paramedic student will be able to demonstrate effective communication with patients, family members, other first responders, law enforcement and hospital personnel using verbal, written and electronic methods.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

- 1. successfully complete a minimum of 135 hours of clinical internship while meeting age, complaint and skill requirements.
- 2. perform efficient and through assessments on a variety of patients.
- 3. synthesize assessment data and make appropriate determination of data.
- 4. deliver appropriate management based on assessment and interpretation of data.
- 5. demonstrate practical skills needed for entry-level Paramedic.
- 6. illustrate safety and infection control practices in all situations.
- 7. integrate effective communication with patients and staff.
- 8. maintain professional behavior in a wide variety of clinical settings.

Course Requirements

To earn a grade of "pass" for the course and the student must meet <u>all</u> of the following course requirements.

- Attend 100% of all clinical rotations.
- Have satisfactory preceptor evaluations.
- Paperwork grade of 70%.
- Turn in all clinical badges.
- Complete the BPCC Paramedic Student Minimum Competencies for this course.

• Must pass this course to complete the program.

Course Grading Scale:

Pass- Completes all of the course requirements.

Fail- Does not complete any or all of the course requirements.
