Course Title: Sound Reinforcement

Course Prerequisites: None

Course Description: The students will learn equipment, systems concepts, design, and acoustical problems involved in sound reinforcement for live performances and road work as they relate to a professional concert situation. MUSC 107 and COMM 107 are cross-listed courses – only one of these designated courses will be accepted for credit.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course the student will

- A. operate a variety of sound systems and understand necessary mechanics and implementation of modern sound equipment;
- B. demonstrate the introductory skills that will allow them to begin to plan, design, employ, and operate sound with small systems, large venues, and corporate/broadcast events; and
- C. apply business psychology of event sound as it pertains to clients, associates, artists, and audiences.

- 1. research the nature of sound and apply its principals to the public-address operation. (A)
- 2. research current technological advances in audio manipulation, and look toward future advances in the field and how they will affect the industry. (B, C)
- 3. analyze the concept of audio acoustics. (A)
