Course Title: Nursing Career Success

Enrollment in the 200 Level of Nursing (NURS) courses is limited to those students who have been selected and admitted to the program. Program courses are sequenced by semester and must be taken as a group each semester per program requirements and policies.

Course Description:

This course builds upon previous, concurrent, and prerequisite courses. The course is designed to evaluate and strengthen student readiness to practice as an entry-level nurse, by building on the concepts and knowledge gained from previous nursing courses allowing for the application of theories and concepts associated with nursing leadership, nursing research, and management of care, and professionalism.

Student Learning Outcomes (SLO)

- 1. Professional behaviors including commitment to continued quality improvement, ethical and legal standards of practice, efficient management of resources, patient advocacy and lifelong learning
- 2. Promote safety in the workplace to minimize risk of harm to self, patients, family members and coworkers.
- 3. Use of therapeutic communication techniques which result in optimal relationships with patients and families and teamwork and collaboration with interdisciplinary team members.
- 4. The ability to provide patient-centered care with regard to cultural and life-span diversity in a variety of healthcare settings
- 5. Evidence-based practice to inform the nursing process for clinical judgment and critical decisions making.
- 6. Use of informatics and technology to document, manage patient records and support decision making.
- 7. Competency with the nursing process to assess, plan, implement and modify patient care to promote positive outcomes.

Course Student Learning Outcomes (CSLO)

At the end of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Apply knowledge, gained through reading, classroom and clinical experiences, and be able to identify competent safe nursing care, with utilization of the nursing process, and using effective communication. (SLO: 2,3,6)
- B. Relate knowledge of professional nursing responsibilities including prioritization, delegation, professional accountability, and established legal standards of nursing care for patients and families (SLO: 1,4,7)
- C. Utilize current evidence as a basis for planning nursing care for patients in a variety of healthcare settings including but not limited to medication administration, health assessment, and professional accountability. (SLO: 1,4,5)
- D. Predict the effects of diverse cultural and age related influences in the provision of patient centered nursing care. (SLO: 1,4,7)
- E. Manage ethical use of technology and information systems to discover retrieve and analyze information for decision making and safe nursing practice. (SLO 6)

Objectives

To achieve the course student learning outcomes, the student will meet the following objectives.

- 1. Discuss methods for and legal responsibilities related to appropriate delegation of nursing care to other members of the healthcare team. (CLSO: B, C)
- 2. Describe cultural and life-span diversity needs in patient-centered care from pediatrics to geriatrics and all nursing specialties. (CLSO: D)
- 3. Identify medical and nursing management priorities in treating patients with a variety of healthcare problems. (CLSO: A, B, C)
- 4. Discuss the role of nurses in psychosocial support of patients and families from diverse backgrounds. (CLSO: B, D)
- 5. Identify the nursing implications of procedures used for diagnostic evaluations for a different medical and surgical diagnosis. (CLSO: A, B, C)
- 6. Describe the pathophysiology, clinical manifestations, and management of patients with a variety of diagnosis (CLSO:A, C, D)
- 7. Describe cultural and socioeconomic influences on patients with a variety of healthcare problems. (CLSO: A, C, D).
- 8. Able to prioritize nursing care for a variety of healthcare patients using nursing assessments. (CLSO: B, C)
- 9. Utilize the nursing process as a framework for care of patients. (CLSO: A, C E)
- 10. Perform reflective ongoing self-evaluation of growth in professional nursing practice and attainment of professional practice goals. (CLSO: B)
- 11. Verbalize the use of critical thinking and clinical judgment as a basis for decision making in client care.(CLSO: A)
