Course Description: An introduction to management theory and practice that integrates classical and modern concepts with real-world examples. Emphasizes the evolution of management theory, behavioral theory, organizational theory, and managerial techniques.

- B. demonstrated their ability to apply management theory to business case studies; and
- C. demonstrated their ability to identify various managerial techniques that have been successfully applied to real business situations.

Course Requirements:

- To pass the course, student must achieve a course average of 70% or above.
