Course Prefix and Number: EMTP 215

Credit Hours: 2

Course Title: Field Internship II

Course Prerequisites: Must be currently enrolled in the Paramedic program.

Textbook: None

Course Description:

This course is the final phase of field instruction. The student must demonstrate the ability to lead the EMS team in managing patients in the out of hospital setting. In order to register for EMTP 201 - EMTP 215 student must have been selected for the program.

Learning Outcomes:

- A. At the end of this course, the paramedic student will be able to demonstrate effective communication with patients, family members, other first responders, law enforcement and hospital personnel using verbal, written and electronic methods.
- B. At the end of this course, the paramedic student will demonstrate the ability to lead the EMS team in managing patients in the out of hospital environment while utilizing critical thinking skills.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

1. perform efficient and thorough assessments on a variety of patients.
2. synthesize assessment data and make appropriate interpretation of data.
3. deliver appropriate management based on assessment and interpretation of data.
4. demonstrate practical skills needed for entry-level Paramedic.
5. complete daily field internship evaluation forms with positive outcomes as documented by preceptor.
6. prepare and present station schools as assigned by preceptor.

Course Requirements:

To earn a grade of “pass” for this course the student must meet all of the following course requirements.

- Receive an acceptable score in each area of the BPCC Paramedic Program Affective Evaluation.
- Complete at least 160 hours of field internship in addition to the time accrued in EMTP 214.
- Be cleared by a preceptor
- Paperwork grade of 70%.
- Complete the BPCC Paramedic Student Minimum Competencies for this course.

Course Grading Scale:

Pass- Completes all of the course requirements.

Fail- Does not complete any or all of the course requirements.
