<u>Course Description</u>: This course provides information relating to the features of design and operation of fire alarm systems, water-based fire suppression systems, special hazard fire suppression systems, water supply for fire protection and portable fire extinguishers.

- 3. Explain the operation and appropriate application for the different types of portable fire protection systems. (A)
- 4. Identify the different types and components of sprinkler, standpipe, and foam systems. (A)
- 5. Discuss residential and commercial sprinkler legislation. (A,B)
- 6. Compare the basic components and detectors in a fire alarm system. (A)
- 7. Describe the hazards of smoke and list the four factors that can influence smoke movement in a building. (A)
