Course Title: Directing Styles

Course Prerequisites: None

Course Description: The director's continued study of play production: staging, actor coaching, scenery, lighting, backstage organization, make-up, and costuming; introducing historical directing styles, significant directors, and alternative spaces.

- C. choose a script, audition, cast, rehearse, and present a fully staged one-act play; and
- D. identify significant historical directing trends and influences.

- 4. present a fully staged one act play that the student has directed. (A,B,C)
- 5. complete a director's prompt book recording all director research, planning and activities. (A,B,C)
