Course Description: Consideration of the supervisor and relations with subordinates, colleagues, superiors, unions, and society. Managerial aspects of the first level supervisory position regardless of technical specialties, business or non-business, are emphasized.

- 4. identify situations in which delegation is appropriate and predict how accountability is understood in practice (A,B, and C);
- 5. compose positions on selected human resource techniques and various alternatives a supervisor can employ in different types of organizations (A, B, C, and D); and
- 6. apply and review different ethical responses and their impact on the employees, supervisor, and other organizational stakeholders. (A, B, and C).

Course Requirements:

- To pass the course, student must achieve a course average of 70% or above.
