Course Description:	Study of the properties and interactions of color and its perceptual effects through the application of various design principles. (Studio course, with at least 6 contact hours).

- A. demonstrate the analytical use of color to solve visual problems;
- B. demonstrate knowledge in color mixing to significantly expand a student's abilities to achieve subtle hue variation, degrees of value, color temperature, or purity.
- C. demonstrate a mastery of using the subtractive color system through the double primary method (the use of the RYB system).
- D. demonstrate a mastery of using additive color systems (RGB vs. CMYK).
- E. demonstrate an ability to understand the role of different perceptual characteristics of color.
- F. demonstrate the ability to promote professional color presentation and craft in the execution of visual problems.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

- 1. Create various projects applying the different methods of color theory (A, B, C, D, E).
- 2. Participate in discussions identifying color theory methods and advanced color schemes within various works of art (B, E, F).

- 4. Gain a new appreciation for the application of color through studying color schemes in various designs (E, F)
