Course Title: Teaching and Learning in Diverse Settings II

Course Prerequisites: EDUC 201

Textbook: Turnbull, Ann, Turnbull, Rud, Wehmeyer, Michael, Shogren, Karie. *Exceptional Lives: Practice, Progress, & Dignity in Today's Schools*, 9th Edition.

Course Description: This course, the second of a two-course sequence, focuses on the diverse needs of students and the role of educators in recognizing and addressing learners' needs. Two primary topics will be addressed within the course: Diverse Ways of Knowing and Learning and Professional Issues of Diversity in Education. The course will involve a combination of lecture, group learning, reflection, and site-based experiences within schools.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the course, the student will:

- A. identify diverse learning styles and ways of knowing;
- B. recognize learning preferences of students through observation and use of inventory instruments;
- C. recognize issues of diversity among students as they apply to students with exceptionalities in classroom experiences;
- D. describe programs and practices at the school and community level addressing the diverse needs of students;
- E. describe the rights of children with exceptionalities and the responsibilities of schools and teachers in their education;
- F. apply knowledge of the legal rights that affect the education of children with special needs and minority students;
- G. discuss the process of obtaining special services for a child with exceptionalities

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

- 1. prepare a lesson plan with alternative assessment for each learning style; (A)
- 2. administer a learning inventory to a class and summarize how the results should guide instruction; (B)
- 3. compose a written reflection describing the learning style(s) or intelligence(s) emphasized in lessons observed; (C)
- 4. compose a written reflection describing modifications/accommodations given to students with identified exceptionalities; (C)
- 5. conduct and summarize an interview of an inclusion and/or special education teacher to identify how the teacher meets the needs of diverse students; (D)
- 6. design a technology-rich presentation on ADA and IDEA and the implications for educators; (E)
- 7. write a review of a sample IEP/LAP, with reflection on how prescribed accommodations/modifications help meet the unique needs of an exceptional student; (G) (F)
- 8. summarize a structured interview with SBLC chair detailing the process from identification through implementation of services; (H)

Course Requirements:

- A. attend class regularly;
- B. engage in required and supplemental readings;
- C. prepare for and participate in class and small group discussions, written assignments, and CANVAS discussions;
- D. complete 20 hours of field experience at a chosen work site
- E. create an electronic portfolio.
