- C. Assess the impact of major events since statehood.
- D. Analyze the causes and effects of the Civil Rights Movement in Louisiana from the 1940s to present.
- E. Evaluate the impact of environmental events on the culture, economy, and landscape of Louisiana

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

- 1. Identify the different Native American tribes present at the time of European exploration and the European countries (Spain, France, Great Britain, later the U.S.) that sought control and, at different points, did control Louisiana (A, B)
- 2. Characterize the French and Spanish leaders that governed Louisiana and the legacies they left upon its development of and mitigation of African slavery (A, B)
- 3. Critique the circumstances surrounding the Louisiana Purchase and the subsequent changes in government under American rule (B)
- 4. Summarize the causes and effects of all wars in which Louisiana was involved from colonial times to present (B,C)
- 5. Explain Reconstruction, Bourbon Rule, Plessy v. Ferguson, Jim Crow Laws and their impact on Louisiana. (C,D)
- 6. Describe the development of the Civil Rights Movement in Louisiana in the 1940s and 1950s and the Civil Rights Movement's impact from the 1960s to present day (C,D)
- 7. Investigate the impact of catastrophic events, including the 1927 Mississippi River Flood and Hurricanes Audrey, Betsy, and Katrina (C,E)

8. Examine the state governors and governments of Louisiana since its statehood in 1812, including the social and political forces involved in each administration (C)
