**Course Title:** Criminal Investigations

## Course Prerequisites: None

**Course Description:** This course describes the basic aspects of investigative work, documenting the crime scene, searching people and property, collecting and preserving evidence, obtaining information through interviews and interrogations, identifying suspects, investigating deaths, assault, domestic violence, sex crimes, crimes against children, robbery, larceny, white-collar and environmental crime, as well as the investigation of computer crime, drug sales and trafficking, and terrorism.

## **Learning Outcomes:**

At the end of this course, the student will:

- A. recognize proper basic investigative responsibilities of police officers and investigators;
- B. recognize the proper techniques of investigating personal and property crimes;
- C. recognize the total methodology used to deal effectively with 21<sup>st</sup> Century crime as police organizations gear up to expand their role with the advent of the Patriot Act.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

- 1. explain basic investigatory functions from first response to closing the case; (A)
- 2. explain and describe proper methods in dealing with violent crime; murder, robbery, assault, sexual assault, crime against children, larceny, drug and hate crime, computer crime and the effect of terrorism on police investigations and methods; (B)
- 3. explain how technology and new changes in law affect the police role in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. (C)
