Course Title: Teaching and Learning in Diverse Settings I

Course Prerequisites: None

Course Description: This course will introduce pre-service teachers to major issues faced by educators, effective teaching, educational reform and legal issues of education and professionalism to include self-assessment of desirable dispositions. Theories of human development and learning significant to the classroom teacher will be explored in class sessions and case studies. Pre-service teachers will explore community services available to students and teachers.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the course, the student will:

- A. Understand legal and ethical issues related to the field of education
- B. Understand the role of teacher, society's expectations, and relevant professional issues
- C. Understand educational reform in Louisiana and the United States
- D. Understand major theories of human development and learning including cognitive development theories, social/emotional development theories, moral development and behavior-based theories
- E. Demonstrate understanding of philosophical and historical foundations of education in the United States

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

- 1. Infer the implications of major laws and court decisions on education (A)
- 2. Identify and analyze the behaviors expected of Louisiana's teachers as outlined in the COMPASS teacher evaluation rubric (B)
- 3. Differentiate between the goals of ESEA, NCLB, and ESSA (C)
- 4. Demonstrate knowledge of Piaget's theory of human development and learning, Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, Kolberg's theory of moral development, and Erikson's Model of Psychosocial Development (D)
- 5. Evaluate various educational philosophies and articulate own personal educational philosophy, supported with relevant examples (E)

Course Requirements: The following are intended to help the learner meet the stated learning outcomes of the course: engage in required and supplemental readings; sign into CANVAS at least three times per week; prepare for and participate CANVAS discussions, written assignments, projects, and examinations.
