Course Title: Class Piano II

Course Prerequisites: MUSC 110

Course Description: Post-elementary group piano lessons. This course is a continuation of MUSC 110. Scales, cadences, harmonization, sight reading skills, and repertoire are emphasized.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, the student will

- A. perform all Major and white key minor scales, hands together, two octaves and identify their respective key signatures;
- B. perform the primary chords (I, IV, V7) in all Major keys and white key minors;
- C. harmonize folk melodies using I, IV, and V7 in all Major keys and white key minors;
- D. transpose folk melodies to and from all Major keys; and
- E. perform standard early intermediate piano repertoire by Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, Schumann and Burgmüller using correct notes, rhythms, fingerings and piano technique.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

- 1. recall the layout of the piano keyboard (black and white keys) and the intervals and correct fingerings of all Major Scales through lecture, demonstration, and practice application. (A)
- 2. recall the theoretical construction of the primary triads in all Major keys through lecture, demonstration, and practice application. (B)
- 3. harmonize simple folk melodies through music reading in all Major keys and practice harmonizing simple folk melodies using the primary chords of those keys. (B,C,D)
- 4. sight-read and rehearse standard early intermediate piano repertoire attempting to correctly execute correct notes, rhythms, fingerings, and piano technique. (E)

Course Requirements: This course requires attendance, class participation, assignments, exams, and projects as determined by the instructor.
