readings in literature with emphasis on developing critical essays

and research skills.

- B. use appropriate literary terms to discuss a selection;
- C. write critical essays using patterns of development introduced and practiced in English 101; and
- D. compose an acceptable research paper.

- 1. examine literary works for the purpose of analysis and discussion (A and B).
- 2. apply the vocabulary of literary analysis (A and B).
- 3. formulate a thesis statement concerning a literary work (B, C, and D).

- 5. investigate topics using library resources to write a research paper (C and D).

Course Requirements: Each student is responsible for completing an acceptable MLA

research paper, reading and analyzing selected literature, and

writing critical essays based on literary readings.
