Course Description:	A study of works by significant writers in American Literature.

At the end of the course, the student will be able to

- A. recognize the historical background of the literary works read;
- B. apply common terms associated with literature;
- C. identify common authors, titles, and themes in American literature; and
- D. write a research paper which includes secondary sources and demonstrates a knowledge of MLA form.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

- 1. see literary works as a reflection of our national consciousness (A and C).
- 2. examine the lives and influences of major American authors (A and C).
- 3. consider works as integrated wholes and as expressions of limited points of view (A, B, C, and D).
- 4. analyze the major themes and literary styles in American literature (B and C).
- 5. explore major literary philosophies and American historical events from colonialism to modernism (A, C, and D).

Course Requirements: Students will complete required reading and writing assignments, teacher-made tests, and an MLA research paper.
