Course Prefix and Number: EMTP 214 Credit Hours: 2

Course Title: Field Internship I

Course Prerequisites: Currently enrolled in the Paramedic program.

Textbook: None

Course Description:

This course is the first phase of the paramedic field internship. The student will begin to take a leadership role in providing out-of-hospital emergency care on an ambulance while being supervised by a paramedic preceptor. In order to register for EMTP 201 - EMTP 215 student must have been selected for the program.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, the student will:

- **A.** At the end of this course, the paramedic student will be able to demonstrate effective communication with patients, family members, other first responders, law enforcement and hospital personnel using verbal, written and electronic methods.
- **B.** At the end of this course, the paramedic student will be able to gather data from the scene, patient assessment and diagnostic testing to formulate a field impression and provide appropriate treatment to a patient in the out of hospital environment.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

- 1. perform efficient and through assessments on a variety of patients.
- 2. synthesize assessment data and make appropriate interpretation of data.
- 3. deliver appropriate management based on assessment and interpretation of data.
- 4. demonstrate practical skills needed for entry-level Paramedic.
- 5. complete daily field internship evaluation forms with positive outcomes as documented by preceptor.
- 6. prepare and present station schools as assigned by preceptor.

Course Requirements:

To earn a grade of "pass" for this course the student must meet <u>all</u> of the following course requirements.

- Complete at least 160 hours of field internship.
- Accrue at least 30 patient contacts.
- Paperwork grade of 70%.
- Have satisfactory preceptor evaluations.
- Must pass this course to complete the program.

Course Grading Scale:

Pass- Completes all of the course requirements.

Fail- Does not complete any or all of the course requirements.
