Course Title: Mechanics of Engineering Materials

Course Prerequisite: ENGR 100 and ENGR 220

Textbook: Hibbeler, Russell C. Mechanics of Materials, 9th edition. Prentice Hall. ISBN: 9780133254426

Course Description: A study of the basic principles which include the stress-strain properties of engineering materials, analysis and design of mechanical members subject to axial loading, torsion, bending, shear and combined loading, pressure vessels, Mohr's circle, and deflection in beams.

- A. demonstrate skills in solving problems involving engineering materials;
- B. demonstrate skills in designing building components using material properties; and
- C. demonstrate ability to make judgments about safety factors and potential for overloading material components.
