**Course Prefix and Number:** MUSC 230 -244

**Credit Hours:** 2

**Course Title:** Applied Studio Lessons

**Course Prerequisites:** None

**Textbook(s):** None

**Course Description:** A weekly private one-on-one lesson. Students will study proper performance techniques for their specific instrument or voice. Lessons may include, but are not limited to, traditional repertoire, scales, etudes, orchestral excerpts, solos, chamber music, sight reading, and other skills unique to the instrument or voice. A minimum of 14 lessons per term is required. Music majors must earn a “C” or better. Students must make a grade of “C” or higher before progressing to the next level of a given instrument.

- read and perform music at a higher level of proficiency than when they began the course and course sequence (for subsequent semesters).
