<b>Course Title:</b>	Elementary Spanish II	
<b>Course Prerequisites:</b>	Spanish 101, grade of “C” or higher	
<b>Textbook(s):</b>	Rosetta Stone – 5 month Advantage Headset required	
<b>Course Description:</b>	This second semester course is focused on creating sentences in present, past, future, conditional and other tenses, learning how to translate and how to formulate questions and answers. Students will also continue to study Spanish culture.	

**Learning Outcomes:**

At the end of this course, the student will be able to

- A. write sentences in Spanish;
- B. translate from English to Spanish or Spanish to English;
- C. communicate using different tenses and modes; and
- D. discuss Spanish culture.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

(The letter designations at the end of each statement refer to the learning outcome(s).)

1. conjugate all Spanish verbs in the present, past, future tenses, and conditional mode (A, B, and C).
2. translate Spanish short stories (B).
3. write compositions in the learned tenses (A and C).
4. answer questions on specific themes (A and B).
5. formulate questions and answers based on specific assigned subjects (A, B, and C).
6. produce a report, either orally or in written form, addressing an aspect of Spanish culture (A, B, C, D).

**Course Requirements:**

Students will review present tense and write two papers about it, learn the future and the conditional and write two papers about it, and translate a short story showing the use of all other past tenses. Interactive practices, quizzes, and practice translations are required. Students will be evaluated once orally in an interview of five and ten minutes in the middle of the semester. Tests will be given in addition to a comprehensive final.
