Course Description: Course provides practical and theoretical experience in lighting. From basic three point lighting to full set lighting design, its use in both professional and nonprofessional applications are explored. Included in discussion are types of lighting fixtures, gels, lighting techniques and theory. THTR 113 and COMM 203 are cross-listed courses – only one of these designated courses will be accepted for credit.

- D. read and hang a lighting plot;

- 4. use the correct color gels for temperature correction, creating mood and toning film or theatrical sets. (A,B,C,D,E)
