Course Title: Fire Investigation I

**Course Prerequisites:** FRSC 110: Building Construction for Fire Protection. FRSC 120: Fire Behavior and Combustion or Instructor approval

#### Course Description:

This course is intended to provide the student with the fundamentals and technical knowledge needed for proper fire scenic interpretations, including recognizing and conducting origin and cause, preservation of evidence and documentation, scene security, motives of the fire setter, and types of fire causes.

- B. Understand and demonstrate the process of conducting fire origin and cause
- C. Identify and apply the processes of proper documentation

- 1. Demonstrate the importance of documentation, evidence collection, and scene security process needed for successful resolution. (A)
- 2. Understand and demonstrate the process of conducting fire origin and cause investigation. (B)
- 3. Identify the responsibilities of a firefighter when responding to the scene of a fire, including scene security and evidence preservation. (A,B,C)
- 4. Describe the implications of constitutional amendments as they apply to fire investigations to include case law decisions that have affected fire investigations. (A)
- 5. Define the common terms used in fire investigations. (A,B)
- 6. Explain the basic elements fire dynamics, construction, and fire protection systems as to how they affect origin and cause determination. (B)

7. Discuss the basic principles and identify cause and origins of fires. (B) Recognize potential health and safety hazards. (A)

### **Course Requirements:**
