Course Prefix and Number: CTEC 240

Credit hours: 3-3-0

Course Title: Internet Protocol (IP) Telephony

Course Prerequisites: CTEC 155

Textbook(s): None.

Course Description: This course is an introduction to voice and data communications as used in modern business environments. Topics covered in this course include cabling, network and internet technologies, telephony, and implementation considerations.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the course, the student will:

- A. understand fundamentals of telecommunications;
- B. discuss industry cabling standards;
- C. identify communication and transmission systems; and
- D. discuss how an IP telephony network works.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will or will be able to:

1. understand VoIP concepts and components; (A)
2. understand what "digital" is, how voice and video are digitized; (A)
3. identify different types of cabling; (B)
4. determine when different types of cabling would be used; (B)
5. compare and contrast voice and data transmissions; (C)
6. identify fundamentals of frames and packets; (C)
7. understand networking fundamentals in a telephony system: (D) and
8. discuss the important concept of prioritizing or managing telephony traffic. (D)

Course Requirements:

1. Achieve a course average of 70% or above on all learning outcomes.
