Course Description:

This course provides the principles of fire ground control through utilization of personnel, equipment, and extinguishing agents.

- 3. Identify the basics of building construction and how they interrelate to pre-fire planning, strategy, and tactics. (A)
- 4. Describe the steps taken during size-up. (A)
- 5. Examine the significance of fire ground communications. (A)
- 6. Identify the roles of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and Incident Management System (ICS) as it relates to strategy and tactics. (B)
- 7. Demonstrate the various roles and responsibilities in ICS/NIMS. (B)

Course Requirements:

- 1. The student must successfully complete the course with an average of 70% or above on the combined learning outcomes.
