Title: Advanced EMT Applications

Corequisites: Enrolled in EMTP 150

Prerequisites: Louisiana Licensed EMT

Textbook: None

Course Description: The purpose of this course is for the Advanced EMT student to complete patient care experience under the supervision of an approved preceptor, in the clinical and the field setting.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course the student will be able to:

- A. demonstrate effective communication with patients, family members, other first responders, law enforcement and hospital personnel using verbal, written and electronic methods.
- B. administer medications safely to live patients.
- C. establish vascular access in a live patient; and
- D. demonstrate effective communication with patients, family members, other first responders, law enforcement and hospital personnel using verbal, written and electronic methods.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will:

1. perform efficient and thorough assessment on a variety of patients. (A)
2. successfully complete a minimum of 60 clinical hours while meeting age, complaint and skill requirements. (A,B, C, D)
3. successfully complete a minimum of 60 field hours while meeting age, complaint and skill requirements. (A,B, C, D)
4. synthesize assessment data and make appropriate interpretations. (A)
5. deliver appropriate management based on assessment and interpretation of data. (A)
6. complete daily field evaluation forms while achieving positive outcomes as documented by the preceptor. (A, B)
7. illustrate safety and infection control practices in all situations.(A, B, C, D)
8. integrate effective communication with patients and staff. (B, C)
9. maintain professional behavior. (B, C)

Course Requirements

To earn a grade of “pass” for the course the student must meet all of the following course requirements.

- Attend 100% of all clinical rotations
- Paperwork grade of 70% or higher.
- Have satisfactory preceptor evaluations

Course Grading Scale:

Pass- Completes all of the course requirements.

Fail- Does not complete any or all of the course requirements.
