Course Prefix and Number: SPAN 201 **Credit hours:** 3

Course Title: Intermediate Spanish

Course Prerequisites: Spanish 102, grade of “C” or higher

Textbook(s): Contrasena 3.0 (Custom). Lingro Learning.

Course Description: This third semester course is focused on creating sentences in the subjunctive mode, learning how to translate, and how to formulate questions and answers. Students will also continue to study Spanish culture. The Louisiana Statewide Common Course Catalog name and number for this course are CSPN 2013 (3 Hr): Intermediate Spanish I.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, the student will be able to

- A. write opinions in Spanish;
- B. translate from English to Spanish or Spanish to English;
- C. communicate using different tenses and modes; and
- D. use punctuation correctly.

To achieve the learning outcomes, the student will

(The letter designations at the end of each statement refer to the learning outcome(s).)

1. conjugate all Spanish verbs in the conditional and other tenses (A and C).
2. translate Spanish short stories (B and C).
3. write compositions in the appropriate tenses (A, C, and D).
4. answer questions on specific themes (A, C, and D).
5. formulate questions and answers based on specific assigned subjects (A and C).

Course Requirements:

Students will review present tense and write two papers about it, learn the future and the conditional and write two papers about it, translate a short story showing the use of all other past tenses. Interactive practices, quizzes, and practice translations are required. Students will be evaluated once orally in an interview of five and ten minutes in the middle of the semester. Tests will be given in addition to a comprehensive final.
